AFFIRM AWARD HISTORY

AFFIRM was one of the first associations to recognize outstanding individuals in our government with an awards program. Starting in its first year, 1979, AFFIRM focused its recognition on one government executive with its Executive Leadership Award in Information Resources Management.

In the early part of the 2000s, AFFIRM expanded its Leadership Awards to recognize additional outstanding individuals in various award categories. The award categories were based upon the major administration or other government-wide initiatives. We also added an award to recognize an outstanding industry leader.

Recipients of our highest award, the Executive Leadership Award for Information Resources, have included members of the House of Representatives, Senate, Office of Management and Budget, departments, and administrations—elected officials, appointees, and career civil servants. The key criteria is that of “Outstanding Executive Leadership”—leadership beyond their specific organization and leadership that has been exemplified by outstanding results and actions that have improved the management of information technology for our wonderful country.

Deputy Chief, Program Development, U.S. Air Force Reserve Command

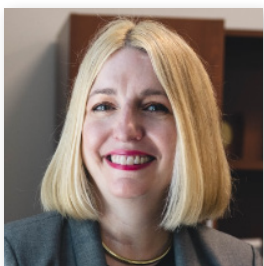

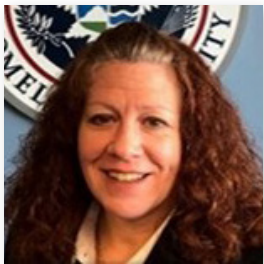

Tanya Turner

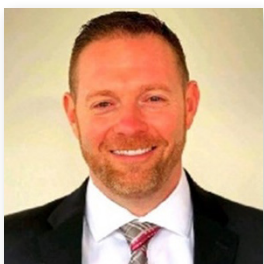
Program Specialist / Contracting Officer Representative (COR) in the Office of the Chief Information Officer (OCIO), U.S. Department of Homeland Security

Identity Management Capability Manager, U.S. Transportation Security Administration



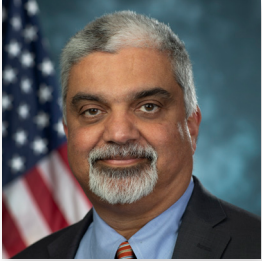

Program Director, National Aeronautics and Space Administration

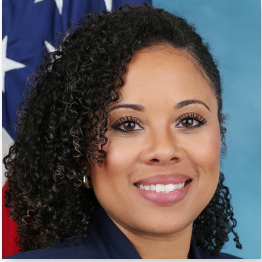

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KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Eric Hysen

Chief Information Officer & Chief Artificial Intelligence Officer, U.S. Department of Homeland Security



Eric Hysen serves as the Chief Information Officer (CIO) for the Department of Homeland Security. Mr. Hysen was sworn in as CIO on February 1, 2021. On September 14, 2023, Secretary of Homeland Security Alejandro N. Mayorkas also named him the Department's first Chief Artificial Intelligence (AI) Officer.

As CIO, Mr. Hysen is responsible for strategically aligning the Department's Information Technology (IT) personnel resources and assets, including security, infrastructure, and delivery, to support core DHS missions and activities. As Chief AI Officer, Mr. Hysen promotes AI innovation and safety within the Department and advises Secretary Mayorkas and Department leadership on AI issues.

Mr. Hysen most recently served on the Biden-Harris transition's Technology Strategy & Delivery team, working to develop the administration's plans to leverage technology and delivery in support of policy priorities. He previously was a Senior Fellow at the National Conference on Citizenship, where he led projects to use technology, data, and design to address pressing public policy challenges. He also worked in state government, helping to launch the California Office of Digital Innovation, and in philanthropy, supporting nonprofits working to advance immigration and criminal justice reform.

Mr. Hysen previously served as the Executive Director of the Department of Homeland Security Digital Service. In that leadership role, his teams worked to transform DHS' most critical services by bringing top software engineering, product management, and design talent from the private sector to partner with innovators inside government. DHS Digital Service projects included immigration benefits processing, refugee admissions, and international trade.

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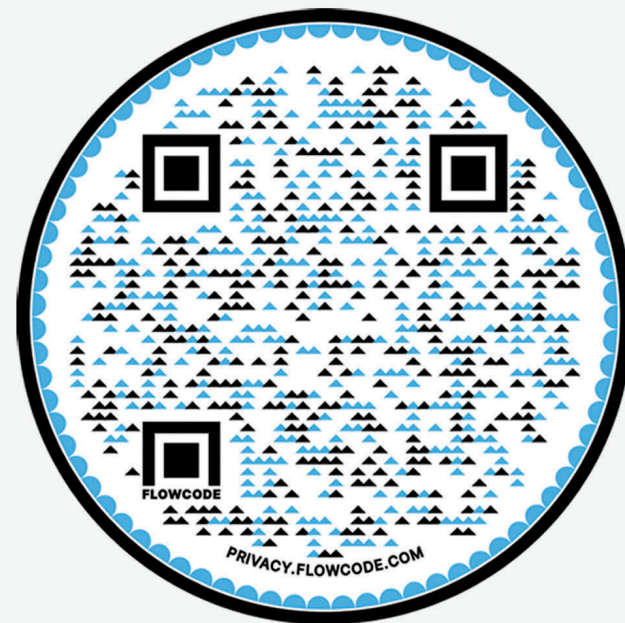
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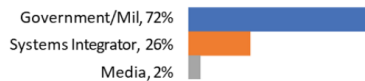
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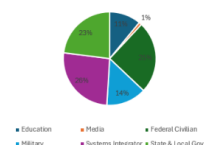


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
